Best School Library Competition

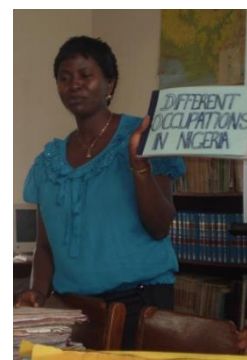

Comic Book Writing for Literacy Workshops

Prof. Obiajulu Emejulu, on sabbatical with the Department of Library & Information Science, led a series of workshops on how to use creation of comic books as a way of developing literacy and creative skills. The first was a trainers' workshop held in Feb.-March, 2013 for members of the Children's Centre Committee, lecturers, teachers from award-winning primary schools, and Nsukka prison warders. Skills learned were first applied in activities with children during the Long Vacation Programme. In October 2013, Prof. Emejulu and the trainees were joined by the originator of the comic book writing programme, Dr. Michael Bitz from Ramapo University in the United States, for a teachers' workshop preceding the Reading Association of Nigeria (RAN) Mid-term Conference hosted at the University of Nigeria.

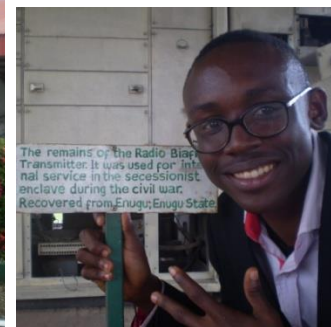

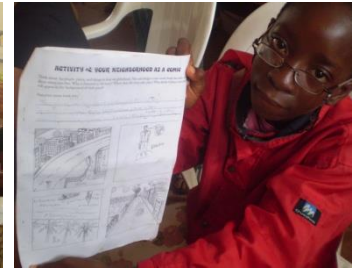
